

**Note:** Following descriptions include general restrictions, but things change and you may find other restrictions posted when you arrive depending on Park conditions, etc.

**CIMARRON CANYON STATE PARK** is seated high in the mountains at 8,000 feet where spectacular palisade cliffs and clear running waters dominate the landscape. It covers 33,000 acres of wildlands.

There are three developed campgrounds and one tent camping area at Cimarron Canyon State Park. In total, there are 100 developed sites, other facilities include restrooms.

### **TRAIL SUMMARY:**

**Clear Creek Canyon Trail** - Cimarron Canyon State Park's most popular trail, the Clear Creek Canyon Trail, is a moderate 7-mile roundtrip.

**Jasper-Agate Trail** - A 4-mile old logging road trail that is steep and rocky but wide.

**Maverick Canyon Trail** - A 10-mile old logging road trail that is steep and rocky but wide.

**Tolby Creek Canyon Trail** - A 14-mile old logging road trail that is steep and rocky but wide.

### **TRAIL DETAIL:**

#### **Clear Creek Canyon Trail**

**Difficulty:** Moderate

**Elevation:** 8,000 Feet (2,493.8 Meters)

**Length:** 7 Miles (11.67 Kilometers) Round Trip

Cimarron Canyon State Park's most popular trail, the Clear Creek Canyon Trail, is a moderately difficult seven mile roundtrip. Following Clear Creek through a forest of ponderosa pine and fir, with mountain wildflowers scattered about liberally, it leads to several picturesque waterfalls and pools. Open to hiking only, the trail is relatively easy to follow and has lots of shade, crossing the creek on a log footbridge.

- Open only to hiking and walking.
- Closed to horses, bicycles, and vehicles

**Seasonal Information:** It is normally open: year-round, and is the only trail in Cimarron Canyon that is open during deer fawning and elk calving season May 15 thru July 31. It is also the only trail open during hunting season.

#### **Jasper-Agate Trail**

**Difficulty:** Moderate to Difficult

**Elevation:** 8,000 Feet (2,493.8 Meters)

**Length:** 4 miles (6.67 Kilometers)

Like many of the old logging road trails in Cimarron Canyon State Park, the 4-mile Jasper-Agate Trail is steep and rocky but wide. The distance is based on following the trail until it fades out and disappears.

- Open to Hiking, Walking, and Horseback Riding
- Closed to bicycles and vehicles.

**Seasonal Information:** Normally Open Year-round except:

- Closed May 15 thru July 31 for deer fawning and elk calving season.
- Closed during hunting seasons to all but those with valid hunting licenses.

#### **Maverick Canyon Trail**

**Difficulty:** Moderate to Difficult

**Elevation:** 8,000 Feet (2,493.8 Meters)

**Length:** 10 Miles (16.67 Kilometers)

Like many of the old logging road trails in Cimarron Canyon State Park, the 10-mile Maverick Canyon Trail is steep and rocky but wide. The distance is based on following the trail until it fades out and disappears.

- Open to Hiking, Walking, and Horseback Riding
- Closed to bicycles and vehicles.

**Seasonal Information:** Normally Open Year-round except:

- Closed May 15 thru July 31 for deer fawning and elk calving season.
- Closed during hunting seasons to all but those with valid hunting licenses.

#### **Tolby Creek Canyon Trail**

**Difficulty:** Moderate to Difficult

**Elevation:** 8,000 Feet (2,493.8 Meters)

**Length:** 14 Miles (23.33 Kilometers) Round Trip

Like many of the old logging road trails in Cimarron Canyon State Park, the 14-mile Tolby Creek Canyon Trail is steep and rocky but wide. The distance is based on following the trail until it fades out and disappears.

- Open to Hiking, Walking, and Horseback Riding
- Closed to bicycles and vehicles.

**Seasonal Information:** Normally Open Year-round except:

- Closed May 15 thru July 31 for deer fawning and elk calving season.
- Closed during hunting seasons to all but those with valid hunting licenses.
